September 14 Showcase - T. M. Hanna

Thomas Michael Hanna disappeared from the small western Pennsylvania village of his birth many years ago. The locals still talk, of course, about the lad with a penchant for good-natured mischief, Vernor's ginger ale, and girls. Oh, and music, too, let's not forget that.

"TM," as he came to be called, started playing and writing songs very early, but nobody could figure out where he got his inspiration. In a bucolic village of less than 100 people, with hills and valleys and woods and creeks all over, he seemed to channel a different universe. Folks marveled at TM's bent for banging on bongos and singing surf songs, like he was an alien plopped into their midst. Well, perhaps "marveled" is the

wrong word, a tad euphemistic for the actual reaction. TM found it easier to remove himself to more private places to tinitinnabulate and extol the atolls, places where his family and neighbors wouldn't hear him. Initially this was out in the woods around the town, where he could furtively pursue his art. On one of these outings he stumbled upon someone else's remote spot for furtive activity, a clandestine stash of, um, well, "art" magazines – he wrote a song about it, of course. Maybe he'll do it for the showcase, with bongos and Dick Dale surf guitar for accompaniment... but we digress.

TM soon began exploring the world far beyond the village, and has seen most of this country up close. He's tinkered at playing almost every instrument imaginable, but has settled on the mandolin as his ace axe. His musical tastes have expanded, too - he's got a remarkable knowledge of Pop and Folk musicology, especially about American songwriters of the last 200 years. Mention a song, and he'll know all about its writer and recording history. To top it off, he's a witty stand-up comedian for the patter between songs.

Over the years, TM has performed with a variety of groups, like the Justis League, the Space Time Gourmets, the Mad Cows, and the Porch Monkeys. He's played all over, but keeps coming back to the Folk Club because it's the only place where his eccentricities are overshadowed by everyone else's, and the challenge to rise to our level is inspiring. Accompanying TM for the showcase will be **Eric Forthman** on guitar and bass, a former compatriot from the **Space Time Gourmets.** Don't miss it!

Tim Harrison is one of Canada's finest singer-songwriters on the folk music landscape today, whose poignant themes and vivid images reveal him as a storyteller of our time, an archetypal traveler singing with compassion and hope. Revered in his home Canada, Tim has released seven albums since 1979, including *Train Going East* (produced by Stan Rogers), *In the Barroom Light* on Fogarty's Cove label, and *The Stars Above, Bridges, Tim Harrison, Sara and The Sea*, and *Wheatfield With Crows* — which positioned Tim in the top 5 of Canadian folk musicians (re: folkdj-1).

'Song of Thanksgiving' from *Wheatfield With Crows* was published in the Fall issue of America's premier roots music magazine, "Sing Out", and included on their compilation CD. Tim is currently recording a new collection of songs due for release in the fall of 2004.

Tim has been described as a "wizard with words, wringing poetry from our everyday struggles and making those subtle shifts in imagery that make a great songwriter. He has the all-too-rare ability to reach inside and body forth lyrics that are from the heart and real. The true heritage of folk music - alive not archival." What is remarkable as well is Tim's ability to evoke the essence and mood of his lyrics as much through his beautifully wrought arrangements as through his verse. Tim is known for rendering a dynamic and powerful performance that never fails to delight. His wit, rapport with audiences, and storytelling are legendary. He is one of those rare artists, whose talents in the studio translate to the stage and vice versa, creating an inspiring and magical presence in both musical forums.

Tim has played everywhere from the **Philadelphia Folk Festival** to Toronto's Harbourfront Centre for the Performing Arts, the Stan Rogers Folk Festival to New York's Speakeasy and Café Lena, and from England's Midland Arts Centre to Scotland's An Lanntair Arts Centre.

Tim was the **founding artistic director** of the Summerfolk Music and Crafts festival in Owen Sound, the artistic director of the All-Canadian Mariposa Festival, Northwinds folk festival and the Eaglewood Folk Festival. Tim was recognized with the **Porcupine Award** for his work in building and sustaining folk music in Canada.

To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
