

#### November 16 Showcase – Kevin Harp By Dan Grove

Kevin Harp is from Louisville, Kentucky, home to a wealth of bluegrass. He loved the festivals in town as he was growing up, but like most of us he listened to the Beatles and rock music, too. Then the Navy took Kevin pretty far from his roots to Florida, and all around the Pacific Rim while stationed in Hawaii and Okinawa. One thing that stayed the same during this transition was running - he was a high school athlete, and he kept at it while on tour. He did 10K runs, his best in 32 minutes 30 seconds, and one marathon, in Hawaii, in about 2 hours and 30 minutes. This is fast, folks! He doesn't run that hard anymore, but has recently added biking and swimming to his repertoire - he did the Lums Pond Duathlon this summer, and plans to do his first triathlon next year.

The Navy had Kevin working on computer systems, and in 1982 they transferred him to this area. There were lunchtime concerts at his DC base on Nebraska Avenue, and a band that played regularly, Bill Emerson and Country Current, did bluegrass. The old roots got watered, and, when Kevin's second child was born, he got a guitar so he'd have something fun to do while keeping an eye on her. He started by picking out Wildwood Flower, and soon got into fiddle tunes. He does Doc Watson and Norman Blake covers, and counts Dan Crary and Tony Rice as strong influences. Kevin's kids are now twelve and nine, and his favorite things to do are spend time with them and play music, frequently both at once.

Kevin left the Navy after ten years, moved to Herndon in 1986, and has been working in systems at Freddie Mac for the last 16 years, in the same group as Folk Club President Ray Kaminsky. For his showcase, expect some old country and bluegrass tunes, plus opportunities for us to sing along. Richard Cottingham, a picking buddy if Kevin's from Leesburg, will sit in on guitar. Don't miss it!

Small Potatoes is Jacquie Manning and Rich Prezioso. This Chicago-based duo has been touring on the folk circuit for years and is quickly becoming less and less of a well-kept secret. They've performed in clubs, coffee-houses across the U.S., as well as major festivals, including the Philadelphia Folk Festival, the Walnut Valley Folk Festival, and Summerfolk Festival in Ontario. Jacquie is a winner of the 1998 Kerrville New Folk Songwriting Contest. Their latest release, Waltz of the Wallflowers (A Dysfunctional Duet), is receiving rave reviews.

They call themselves eclecto-maniacs. They describe their music as "Celtic to Cowboy" and say it has taken them "years of careful indecision" to come up with a mix of music that ranges from country, blues, and swing to Irish, with songwriting that touches on all of those styles and more. Their two recordings, "Raw" and their new album "Time Flies", on Folk Era Records, cover all these styles. Dirty Linen magazine called them "one of

the most polished, inventive, and entertaining shows on the circuit." Sing Out! magazine called "Time Flies" a "wonderful, wonderfully eclectic" album and said "Small Potatoes might well be leading mainstays on the folk scene for years to come." "Time Flies" has enjoyed wide airplay on NPR and other folk oriented stations across the country. Bill Staines says, "These folks are wonderful; fun, energetic, and great musicians. They're two of my favorite performers."

When you see Small Potatoes perform, you hear two great voices, some fine guitar playing, and a touch of tin whistle, flute, mandolin, bodhran and other percussion toys. Together they present a truly rare blend of vocal, instrumental, songwriting and arranging talents; that provides the audience with traditional songs that seem fresh and new, and contemporary songs that seemed steeped in tradition. They even yodel. And they also pay attention to the little things, the warmth, the humor and a rapport with audience that makes them one of the most popular acts around.

One may also consider bringing along the smaller family members to this concert. Small Potatoes began doing children's shows a few years ago. Jacquie was a Girl Scout until she was about 30, and with years of troop leading and camps, has taught a ton of songs for kids. Rich, on the other hand, never went to camp - he is what you would call "Camp Song Challenged". He points out, however, that he was once a kid and, judging by the number of times he's been told to grow up, may still be one. All this adds up to fun for kids and parents. Everyone is encouraged to participate with sing-alongs, stomp-alongs and pantomime.
