

November 8 Showcase – Joe Shade by Joe

Once upon a time there was a musician from St. Louis named Joe. He played in glam and glitter rock bands when the local music scene was populated mostly by southern boogie. Wisely, he left town in the late 1970's seeking his musical fortunes in the East Village of New York.



After several abortive attempts at success and with a band destined to become the American version of ABBA, success was within his grasp. A single, recorded for Chiswick Records in England, under the moniker "Pin-Ups" (that's Joe and Norman on the cover photo), got good reviews but went nowhere—a common phenomenon in the music business. Leveraging the record, Joe and his long-time songwriting partner Norman were chosen to participate in an ASCAP workshop run by Rupert Holmes on "New York Pop".

They were pop songwriters! But workshops do not pay the rent. After 8 years of struggle and risking it all, the "career" had come to the end

Many years passed and music became a thing on the shelf. After 9/11, it became obvious to him that life was a precious gift, and that led to his return to the business of writing, recording, and gigging. In 2007, he worked with Billy Bragg on the Jail Guitar Doors project, producing several benefit concerts with local area musicians, and learned how much effort it takes to put on shows.

In the past year, he's been a regular at the Reston Herndon Folk Club performing both old and new songs of his. As an accomplished songwriter he is grateful for the Folk Club, knowing how special it is when someone actually listens. Joe would also like to thank Rich Battaglia and Sherry Stewart for joining him on stage.

Master guitarist-singer-songwriter Brooks Williams released his first album early in 1990. The Washington *Post* wrote a glowing review which prompted National Public Radio's invitation for Williams to appear on *All Things Considered* with Noah Adams. And that's where it all began. The tours followed and so did the albums. Counting the new one, he has done twenty-nine in all and has never looked back.

On the 2nd Tuesday of the month (usually), we feature a "Showcase" of a Folk Club member in a 24-minute performance. To do a Showcase you must: 1) be a paid-up Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 12 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
