Music

What do we really know about each other?

I was in Merry Makers, singing and performing in retirement homes, schools, and churches for about fifteen years. When I joined, I was near the youngest. Very gradually I learned some things about mv fellow performers' former lives. Some interesting examples: a female Federal judge by way of the Marine Corps who knew and loved Kris Kristofferson: a Broadway opera singer and

dancer; a millionaire policeman who worked in SE DC and loved his beat; a Capitol Hill worker who started Roll Call and was personally connected to some Supreme Court justices; a fiddle player who had his own fiddle event in Arlington named after him (Speedy Tolliver); a frisbee golf player who had a Frisbee Golf event named after him (former FC member Ragnar Overby); and our piano-playing leader (Helen Mulroney) was an Admiral's wife. The cast of characters changed glacially over that time period, and it was the Music that bonded us together and helped foster good friendships.

At the Folk Club, we sit together for about three hours on many evenings a year. Through the years we learn snippets and slices about each other. The point is that, just like in Merry Makers, it is the Music that bonds us together. In this covid-tainted impersonal time, Music is a powerful antidote that helps enrich our lives. I am so grateful for the friendships resulting from our love of Music. Perhaps several of those friends will join me in my third Folk Club Showcase.




Theme Night: Songs from Movies or Musicals October 17, 2023



I'm sure all of us can remember hearing certain songs for the first time in a movie or a musical, where they made an emotional impact relating to the story. Whether that was in a classic movie like *The Wizard of Oz* or *Saturday Night Fever*, or a Broadway musical like *Fiddler on the Roof* or *Hamilton*, the songs stayed in our memories. SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

On the 2nd Tuesday of the month (usually), we feature a "Showcase" of a Folk Club member in a 24-minute performance. To do a Showcase you must: 1) be a paid-up Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 12 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
