I feel like the dog that caught the car. In past instances when I won the showcase drawing, I would have decided within several days on songs and personnel for the show. This time I'm way behind, partly due to my idea of doing this performance mostly solo. I have the good fortune to have so many occasional and regular collaborators that I could have a different band for each song, but stage logistics being what they are I know that would not be optimal. I'll conclude this prelude by saying that since the pandemic, I have been particularly grateful for the regular collaborators I've had, Rick Landers and Rosie Licks (Tom and Sherry).

Right now, I have 4-5 songs which I've wanted to do for a long time but was somewhat intimidated by, or wasn't confident in how well I could do them. I'm still working on those, but am secure in the knowledge that I can go to old

standbys if I decide the new ones aren't ready for prime time. I've gotten a bassist, my friend John Werntz, to hopefully keep me on track and give me feedback on these new (to me) songs.

Many members have probably noticed I gravitate to songs which have a message that I feel strongly about, and these new songs follow in that tradition. A couple of the songs are a little off the beaten path, but in one case quite the opposite, an iconic song which all will recognize at once.

Finally, I will say (again) - one thing that has kept me coming back to the Folk Club is the nurturing environment that has been a trademark as long as I have been attending, 20 years or more. I'm always grateful for the words of encouragement fellow members take the time to pass along.

Memories of Music with Mark

It must have been about 1985 (give or take a year) when we first met Mark Elliott at the Reston Folk Club in Reston, VA (subsequently renamed The Folk Club of Reston-Herndon). Mark came to the Tuesday night open mike with his parents, Phyllis and Courtney. We were pleasantly surprised to meet a 17-year-old avid Kingston Trio fan. But there he was, an excellent singer and guitar player at the open mike performing songs like MTA, Hard Traveling, Greenback Dollar. And, he sang songs he had written himself.

One of the first of Mark's songs that I recall was one about a special needs boy, from

the perspective of his brother. If I remember correctly, part of the refrain went "He may be slow, but he's always right on time." It was a poignant story and for a while I assumed the song was autobiographical; I thought Mark had a special-needs brother. I later learned Mark was an only child. That he had the empathy and imagination to write such a song was impressive.

At some point my wife Beverly and I, and Mark, decided it might be fun to get together and work up some vocal trios accompanied by two guitars and a banjo. It turned out to be a lot of fun. We would usually meet at our house and work up three songs to present at the Tuesday night Reston Folk Club open mike. One of the first songs we did was "Early Morning Rain".

We eventually had enough repertoire to perform in public and did from time to time. We struggled to find a decent name for our trio. Eventually Mark's dad, Courtney, told us he had been saving for a rainy day, a great name for a band. He decided to let us use it. The name was "New Horizon" taken from the line "out on the new horizon" from the Bob Lind song "Elusive Butterfly." We loved the name and used it. We managed to book a few paying gigs from time to time as "New Horizon".

Eventually Mark decided he needed to move on and pursue his musical career solo. We were disappointed, but it made perfect sense and so we were supportive. Mark began recording his first album in Tim Davis's home recording studio "West Texas East Recording". Bev and I provided some of the backup vocals, guitar and banjo. It was our first studio recording experience and a great deal of fun. The album is titled "Common Ground" and showcases Mark's original songs.

Mark cultivated a relationship with Tom Paxton who advised, "If you are serious about being a songwriter, you really need to move to Nashville." Those of us who knew Mark in his Reston Folk Club days are impressed by his musical successes, and proud to have known him.

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

On the 2nd Tuesday of the month (usually), we feature a "Showcase" of a Folk Club member in a 24-minute performance. To do a Showcase you must: 1) be a paid-up Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 12 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
