## February 11 Showcase – Larry Rice

Born the same year as the discovery of the DNA molecular structure and Pat Benatar (1953), music has been a big part of Larry Rice's life. He started playing bass in a band with his brother Steve and still best friend Dave when he was 12. They called themselves The Testaments of Time. Even though his knees were truly knocking, their best gig was entertaining Army NCO's. They added black schoolmate and singer Ray, and Motown tunes to their set list, so the band became Salt and Pepper.

He was in a rock power trio Andromeda his last two years of high school and learned guitar and banjo before he went to college. Bored during his last semester in the senior year he helped found Flatbush, cowriting, singing, playing bass and fiddle from 1974-1981. Great regional success brought two top ten original singles on Cleveland's WMMS, and opening act gigs for New Riders, Little Feat, and others. Flatbush is in the History of Rock in Cleveland exhibit at the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

Fast forward to two adult daughters, Larry, Lea, and Shannon started playing together as The Big Cheese Band at a Ron Goad event in 2007, the same year he released a solo CD, Little House. Through fifteen years TBCB released 3 LP's, an EP, and a single. 3 original songs charted - "Life on the River" (#1 AAA 2015), "The Christmas Crocodile" (#17 AC 2015), and "Everything" (#15

Relix Jam Bands 2022). Lea and Larry still have fun playing music and will resurrect TBCB later this year, playing super traditional music.



Larry was a member of the Gideon's Trumpet choir at The Falls Church Episcopal from 2018 to 2022. During this time, he wrote four of the five gospel songs on his 2024 solo release, Gospel Gifts. Three songs off of this EP made it into the AAA radio top 20 folk chart, and the EP itself made it to #8, sharing the top 10 with Mark Knopfler, Sarah Jarosz, The Secret Sisters, and the Avett Brothers.

Luckily for Larry he met Ann Granger in 2019. With so many things in common, they must be cousins. Always in danger of bursting into a song or riffing a parody of a song, they started playing as The Two Peas in 2021. They love harmony. They've ventured into songwriting and are in the studio this month to record an EP.

For the showcase, Larry plans on taking the audience on a tour of all the music he's performed in his life.

#### SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

On the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of the month (usually), we feature a "Showcase" of a Folk Club member in a 24-minute performance. To do a Showcase you must: 1) be a paid-up Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 12 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
